

Prior to Arrival

Make sure you have prepared all the necessary documentation required to visit Qatar, including:

Visa requirement

Qatar provides Brunei Darussalam passport holders a visa waiver valid for 30 days upon arrival, which may be extended for a further 30 days.



Purchase Health Insurance

Travellers visiting Qatar are recommended to have a valid health insurance policy covering Oatar's medical facilities.

Those who do not already have an insurance policy are welcome to purchase one for QAR 50.00 (~BND20) on arrival



E-Register


We recommend e-registering with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Brunei Darussalam prior to arriving to Doha, Oatar.
